## DAY 1: SUNDAY, JUNE 14

Optional tour to the AACA museum located at 161 Museum Dr. Hershey, Pa. 17033. Show your AACA membership card for free admission.

Opening banquet at Vissagio's Restaurant banquet hall.

## DAY 2: MONDAY, JUNE 15



Visit Don Barlup's 1926 vintage service station in New Bloomfield for coffee and donuts. Perry county has 14 covered bridges, 6 of which we will cross and 3 which we will view. Our tour will continue to Little Buffalo State Park for a box lunch and short walk across a covered bridge to the historic Shoaff's Mill erected in 1837.

## DAY 3: TUESDAY, JUNE 16



Today our destination is the Army Heritage Center in Carlisle, Pa. From there we will travel to the Masonic Lodge for lunch and a presentation by the Cumberland County Historical Society on the Carlisle Indian

School, the boyhood home of Jim Thorpe. We will then stop at Cumberland Crossings to display our cars to the retirement home residents. Snacks and entertainment will follow.

An optional stop will be at an antique mall in downtown Carlisle.

## DAY 4: WEDNESDAY, JUNE 17



Today's tour takes us across the Susquehanna River to the historic Fort Hunter Mansion and grounds. We will tour the mansion and outbuildings and have a box lunch at their picnic pavillion.



Our next stop will be at the Lake Tobias Wildlife Park in Halifax, Pa. We will tour the wildlife park in an open school bus (weather permitting) and commune with the animals.

## DAY 5: THURSDAY, JUNE 18



The Eastern Museum of Motor Racing will be our destination where the history of dirt track racing comes alive.

Our final stop will be at the 1794 Eichelberger Distillery and Dills Tavern where we will tour the property, have lunch, a tasting session and a visit to the gift shop to purchase that which we tasted.

## DAY 6: FRIDAY, JUNE 19



Our coffee and donut stop will be at the Rolls Royce Museum and Research Center in Mechanicsburg, Pa. We will take a scenic drive past the Yellow Breeches Creek to the Cliff's Collection of vintage cars and an amazing collection of early porcelain and tin signs collected by our host, Don Schell. Lunch will be on your own today. Many restaurants are less than a mile away.

Optional stop at the Lemoyne Antique Mall. Today is a short day as you can load and head to Visaggio's for our closing banquet.
